OBSERVATIONS

- 1. CITIZENS' WELFARE IS LINKED TO ENERGY POLICY
- 2. MODERN ENERGY INFRASTRUCTURE ESSENTIAL FOR COMPETITIVE ECONOMY
- 3. GENERATION EXCEEDS CAPACITY OF THE POWER GRID
- 4. DEVELOPMENT OF RESOURCES REQUIRES STABILITY TO ATTRACT PARTNERS
- 5. GREAT POTENTIAL FOR ENERGY SECURITY
- 6. EFFECT OF MARKET DISTORTIONS
 - DISCOURAGES INVESTMENT IN NEW TECHNOLOGIES/EXPLORATION
 - VULNERABLE POPULATION NOT WELL DEFINED
 - UTILITIES ARE STARVED OF INCOME FOR NEEDED INVESTMENTS
- 7. ENERGY CONSERVATION THE MISSING PIECE
